
We carried out **9,453** inspections.

## Beginning regulation




- While many residents were experiencing good quality care, others were not enabled to live fulfilling lives, did not feel safe, had limited choices and were not engaged in their community.
- Many services were not promoting personcentred care.
- Many residents were living in outdated and poorly maintained buildings.

### In 2023: After 10 years



- There is a culture of human rights-based care being promoted within services.
- More residents are living better lives and are involved in their communities.
- Providers undertake continual quality improvement initiatives to go beyond basic compliance, to improve services for residents.

# Going Forward:



- Continue to support residents to move from congregated settings to community-based settings that better meet their needs.
- Continue to be a voice for residents
